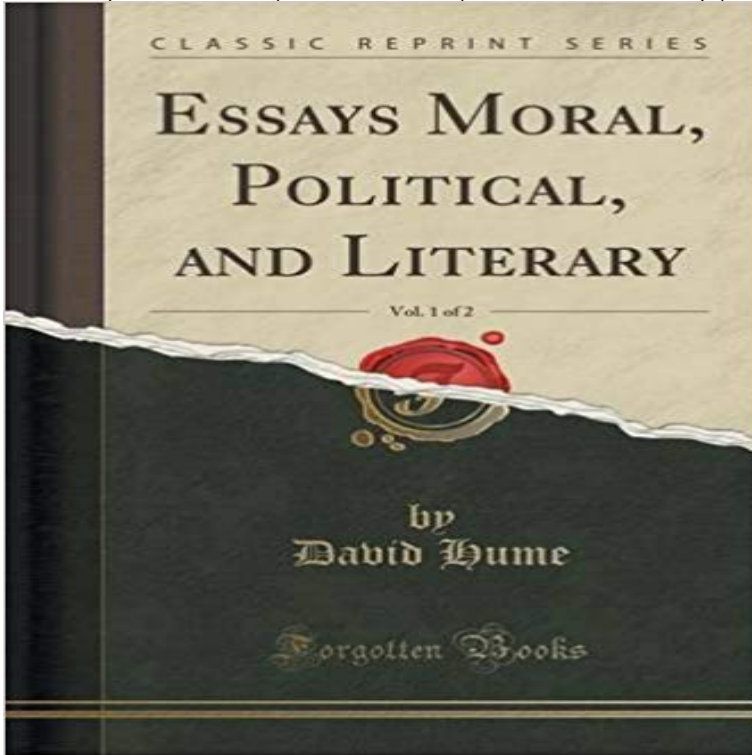

Great pleasures are much less frequent than great pains; so that a sensible temper must meet with fewer trials in the former way than in the latter.
