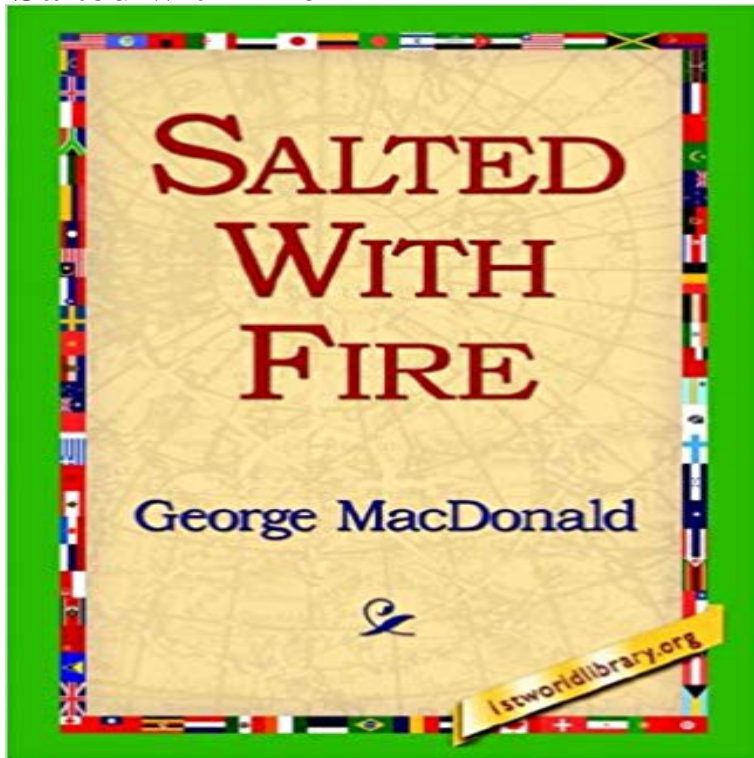


# Salted with Fire
